Junior League of Indianapolis hosts event to celebrate its centennial

JLI has spent the past year commemorating 100 years of service to the Indianapolis community. Since its inception in 1922, JLI has acted to improve the communities where its members live and work. Through community grants, service projects and volunteer hours, JLI is determined to be a catalyst for lasting change in the lives of children and their families.

“The ‘Landmarks and Legacies’ event is a chance for us to honor JLI’s past, celebrate our present and help secure our future,” said JLI president Stephanie Flittner. “We look forward to gathering together to highlight the accomplishments of the League and its members over the past 100 years and set the stage for where we’ll go from here, including kicking off our new community focus area supporting youth in foster and kinship care.”

As JLI embarks on its next century of service, the organization is planning how it can further its impact in new and innovative ways. Each year, JLI members contribute approximately 15,000 hours of service to a variety of nonprofits across Marion County. In addition, JLI awards grants to nonprofits in the Indianapolis community – more than \$4.9 million since 2000.
